IMPORTANT NOTICE to Lewis & Clark Timberlands Recreational Access Permittees

Lewis & Clark Timberlands in Oregon and Washington will re-open to public entry one hour before sunrise (5:58 AM) Friday, September 18, 2020 for **non-motorized access**. Electric bikes (E-bikes/pedal assist bikes) are not allowed. Parking at gates and Access is permitted one hour before sunrise until one hour after sunset. Any gate that may be open is for active Lewis & Clark Timberlands operations only and could be locked at any time and will be locked at the end of each workday.

Fire Season is still in effect and some areas of the forest are still dry. **PLEASE: No Smoking, Camping or Campfires!**

For the **SAFETY** of all, read and obey all signs and stay clear of all forestry related operations. Do not block or park too closely to gates or your vehicle could be towed at your expense. Remember to place your vehicle placard on the dash of your vehicle and have your Recreational Access permit available upon request by a Lewis & Clark Timberlands representative (including security) or a law enforcement officer.

We appreciate your understanding as we deal with inclement weather conditions.

Important Notice to all Lewis & Clark Timberlands Recreational Permittees in Clatsop and Tillamook Counties

Welcome to Lewis & Clark Timberlands and thank you for acquiring your Recreational Access Permit. Lewis & Clark Timberlands, managed by GreenWood Resources, is open to public entry for Non-Motorized access during daylight hours only. Any gate that may be open is for active Lewis & Clark Timberland operations only and can be locked at any time and will be locked at the end of each workday.

Fire Season: Be mindful as you enter the forest that as of July 1, the Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF) officially declared Fire Season in all Northwest Oregon Forests. Due to the forecasted fire weather conditions, ODF is increasing the IFPL in NW1 to a level 2 and NW2&3 are going to Level 3 on Thursday morning at 1:00 am. PLEASE REMEMBER: Camping, Campfires and smoking are always prohibited.

There are many people visiting the tree farm for various activities: hiking, bicycling and hunting (archery season opened August 29) so please be aware of your surroundings. Although GreenWood Resources considers Class 1 e-bicycles to be non-motorized vehicles, the Travel Management Agreement, which is enforced by the Oregon State Police and the Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife, is in effect from August 26 thru November 27, 2020. Oregon State law (under hunting regulations) considers all ebicycles to be motorized vehicles. For the SAFETY of visitors and our contractors and their employees, please read and obey all signs and stay clear of all forestry related operations. Notice to all Lewis & Clark Timberlands Recreational Permittees in Clatsop and Tillamook Counties:

Lewis & Clark Timberlands, managed by GreenWood Resources, are open to public entry for NonMotorized access during daylight hours only. Please be mindful of fire danger. Weather conditions are becoming warmer and dryer, and with windy conditions the forest dries out quickly. Fire season may come early this year. Please remember that smoking and campfires are never allowed. Be aware that you may come across hunters while visiting L&C Tree Farms.

The Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife's Spring Bear hunting is from April 1, through May 31, 2020 and is allowed for hunters with valid licenses & tags – Non-motorized access only.

Please remember:

- Read and obey all signs as some gates may be open for company operations only and can be locked at any time.
- Stay clear of active logging, road maintenance and other forestry operations.
- Do not block or park too closely to gates or your vehicle could be towed at your expense.
- Camping and campfires are prohibited at all times.
- We request your help by reporting any suspicious activity you may come across while on our property to the County Sheriff's Dispatch Center.
